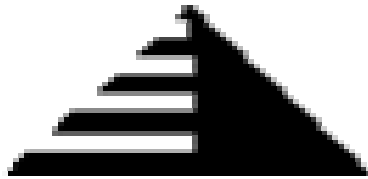

Dalhousie University

Scholarships are available to students at every stage of their academic life through Dalhousie University. Here is how we define students for scholarship purposes:

Definitions

Prospective Undergraduate Student

Students who are thinking of coming to Dalhousie University. They may be coming right from high school, transferring from another university or be a mature student.

High School. A student proceeding directly from high school to Dalhousie or a student who has been out of high school for no more than three years and has not attended another post-secondary institution.

Transfer Student. A student who has attended another post-secondary institution.

Mature Student. A student, who is over the age of 23, has been out of high school for at least four years and has never attended another post-secondary institution.

Undergraduate Students

Students who are registered in an undergraduate program at Dalhousie.

Graduate Student

Students who are registered in a Masters or PhD degree program.

Professional Programs

Students in Law, Medicine or Dentistry.

Prospective Undergraduate Students

Automatic Consideration

If you're applying for admission to Dalhousie direct from high school, you are automatically considered for several merit based scholarships, listed in the table below. To be eligible, you need to submit by March 15th (the early admission deadline):

- an application for admission
- application fee
- official high school transcript
- list of second semester courses, if applicable
- Ontario applicants: OUAC number

Students with an 85% admission average (min. 80% for students from high schools within Atlantic Canada) as of March 15 are eligible for entrance scholarships.

All Canadian and International applicants are considered for scholarships. Renewable scholarships are typically awarded to students with an admissions average in the 90's.

Require an Application

Scholarships listed below require an application. In some cases, students can receive these scholarships in addition to the merit based scholarships. A minimum 80% admissions average as of March 15 is required to be eligible for these scholarships.

Bissett Scholarship

These are renewable. One available at \$24,000 (\$6,000 per year) Apply at high school Applicants from Cole Harbour High School - March 15th

Dalhousie Alumni Leadership/Association Scholarships

Several available between \$1,000 and \$2,000 each Application Open to all High Schools applicants - March 15th

First Nations & Indigenous Black Students Scholarship

These are renewable. 10 available at \$12,000 (\$3,000 per year) Application Residents of NS, NB or PEI - March 15th

Lockward Memorial Scholarship

These are renewable. Several available at \$16,000 (\$4,000 per year) Application/Nomination Applicants from Nova Scotia - March 15th

Maple Leaf Foods Scholarship

2,500 Application. Contact the Office of the Associate Dean of Engineering Applicants to Bachelor of Applied Science (Food Science) - April 30th

Harrison McCain Scholarship

These are renewable. Three available at \$16,000 (\$4,000 per year) Application/Nomination Applicants from Canadian High Schools - March 1st

Lottie Morrison Scholarship

Application. Contact the School of Nursing Applicants intending to study in the area of mental health

North Nova Scotia Highlanders Memorial Award

One at \$300 Application. Contact the Manager of Student Athletics, Dalplex Applicants with a background in leadership and competitive athletics - June 30th

Shatford Memorial Trust Scholarship

This is renewable. Variable Residency confirmed by Nova Scotia Office of Economic Development Residents of Hubbards NS area (at least 3 years) - March 15th

Bursaries

Dalhousie University's Bursary program provides funds to help students experiencing certain types of financial difficulty. Undergraduate Bursaries are meant to assist students in financial need. Bursaries are typically smaller amounts of money (from \$200-\$600), intended to supplement other funding sources. Bursaries won't make up a major part of your funding, but they can fill in the gaps. Bursary applications are normally processed two weeks after the deadline.

When can I apply for a bursary?

Fall	October 1 – October 31
Winter	January 9 to February 17
Spring/Summer	May 15 – June 15

Policy determines who is eligible for these funds; therefore, it's important that you become familiar with the terms that govern the bursary program. Some students participating in a clinical placement may have additional expenses. Students in Graduate Programs, Law, Medicine or Dentistry

Students in the Diploma in Dental Hygiene (DDH) and Masters of Social Work (MSW) can apply through the department. Other students in graduate programs, law, medicine or dentistry need to apply for bursaries through their Faculty:

First Nations & Indigenous Black Students Entrance Scholarship

- 10 renewable scholarship in the amount of \$3000
- awarded to academically gifted students studying in any program
- open to students from NS, NB, and PEI who enter Dalhousie from high school or transfer student
- deadline March 15

Dr. Calvin W. Ruck Scholarship in Social Work

- Black Nova Scotian students enrolled in BSW or MSW
- preference given to Masters students
- demonstrate a desire to improve the social conditions and advance interest of Black Nova Scotians/Canadian people and their communities through study and practice of Social Work
- deadline Oct 15

Guru Nanak Scholarship (Dr. Chehil)

- Black Nova Scotian students registered full time in Engineering
- \$1000 annual renewable scholarship
- academic achievement criteria
- deadline Apr 30

James Robinson Johnston Chair Scholarship

- Black Canadian Scholars in Graduate Studies
- up to \$19,000 per year
- any discipline but applications are encouraged for programs of study that contribute to African Canadian community enhancement
- deadline Mar 15

Nova Scotia Black and First Nations Students Graduate Entrance Scholarship

- Indigenous Black and First Nation Students
- \$15,000 a year
- must be enrolled at Dalhousie and have good academic standing
- must hold an undergrad from Dalhousie

- deadline May 12

Rt. Honorable Robert L. Stanfield Bursary Fund

- Black Nova Scotians registered at Dalhousie in any program
- no predetermined amount
- students must demonstrate financial need
- renewable but reapplication must be made each year

Sen. Donald Oliver Bursary for Black Atlantic Canadians

- Black Atlantic Canadians who are registered full-time at Dalhousie
- no set number or amount depending on spending allocation
- students must demonstrate need
- satisfactory academic standing
- Atlantic Canadian students first then other provinces

Reverend J.W.A. Nicholson Bursary

- Black Nova Scotian students who are registered full time in Arts
- demonstrate financial need

University Prep Bursary College of Continuing Education

- Open to African-Nova Scotian Black and First Nations students
- includes the cost of tuition and MAY cover the costs of texts

Jack & Bernice Prince Bursary

- preference given to African Nova Scotians
- 1st year Law School Students
- based on financial need

- Students enrolled in Arts, Science or Journalism
- \$3,000 renewable for up to 4 years

Alumni Media Scholarship

- African Canadian or Aboriginal students in one year Journalism program
- \$6,000

ATV Media Scholarship

- Preference given to African Canadian or Aboriginal students
- demonstrated interest in television journalism
- \$6,000

Department of Education

African Canadian Services Division University Entrance Scholarship

- \$4,500
- African Nova Scotian student
- 75% average in 5 grade 12 academic subjects
- Must be accepted into and attending a University immediately after high school
- Deadline May 31

African Canadian Services Division Post-Secondary Award

- \$2,500
- African Nova Scotian student
- Less than 75% average
- Available to 2nd & 3rd year university students who have successfully completed their first year and are continuing studies
- Must be accepted into and attending a University immediately after high school
- Deadline July 31

African Canadian Services Division Community College Award

- \$1,800
- African Nova Scotian student
- Successfully completed grade 12 and enroll immediately into a Community College or Trade School
- Awarded for one year only unless this it is a two year program
- Deadline July 31

African Canadian Services Division Performing Arts Award

- \$1,000
- African Nova Scotian student
- Available in conjunction with the University Entrance and Post Secondary Award
- Successfully completed grade 12 and enrolled in a recognized University program (i.e. Bachelor of Music)
- Deadline July 31

African Canadian Services Division Teacher Education Application Award

- \$3,500
- African Nova Scotian student
- Accepted into BEd program
- Must not possess a professional degree
- Demonstrate scholastic success
- 20 scholarships awarded annually
- Deadline June 16

African Canadian Services Division Science Professions

- \$5,000 to \$7,500
- African Nova Scotian student
- Accepted into Science program
- Demonstrate scholastic success
- 5 scholarships awarded annually
- Deadline June 16

The Prince Edward Scholarship

The Prince Edward Scholarship was established by the Province of Nova Scotia in 1987 to commemorate the visit of Prince Edward to the Nova Scotia College of Art and Design in June of that year.

The scholarship is valued at \$6,000 and is awarded to a meritorious Nova Scotia student entering the final year of study in an undergraduate degree program at the Nova Scotia College of Art and Design.

Nova Scotia Women in Engineering Scholarship

The Nova Scotia Women in Engineering Scholarship was established by the Province of Nova Scotia in 1994 in order to encourage women in Nova Scotia to pursue careers in Engineering, to recognize excellence in women in Engineering, and in memory of the fourteen women murdered at the École Polytechnique in Montreal on December 6, 1989.

The award is valued at \$6,000 per year, and may be renewed for a second year of study. The award is open to female students demonstrating academic excellence and leadership, and who have contributed to institution and community activities. Candidates must be residents of Nova Scotia and a graduate of a Nova Scotia high school, and must be entering the third year of study in Engineering at DalTech.

Canadian Millennium Scholarship Foundation

Millennium bursaries of \$1,000 to \$4,500 are awarded each year to post-secondary students who face the greatest financial challenges. These bursaries help students focus on their studies, instead of their debt. Best of all, millennium bursaries do not have to be repaid. You don't have to apply for them, either. You'll be automatically considered for the program when you apply for post-secondary financial assistance in your home province or territory.

- must be accepted into University or College

- must be pursuing degree/diploma in Divinity, Social Work, Nursing, Medicine, Education or other humanitarian fields (i.e. Certified Nursing Assistant, Personal Care Worker etc)
- Does not need to be university offered

- minimum of B average
- Deadline July 15

- \$500
- Adult student studying full or part-time towards their first undergrad degree, diploma or certificate
- Canadian citizen or landed immigrant
- Must have completed one year of university study (4 credits or 24 credit hours)

- \$6,000
- Correctional Workers program at NSCC
- Contact NSCC for more information

BEA Bursary

- must be African Nova Scotian
- resident of Nova Scotia
- graduating student or equivalent
- must demonstrate financial need
- deadline Aug 31

TD Canada Trust Scholarship for Community Leadership

- open to students across Canada in their final year of high school

The Canadian Merit Scholarship Foundation

CMSF is Canada's largest independent granting organization of awards for postsecondary undergraduate study. We identify and support scholars who combine academic excellence with strong leadership potential, entrepreneurial skill and a commitment to service in the community. We place them on university campuses across Canada, where we expect them to contribute significantly and honourably, as exemplary citizens, among the undergraduate student body.

CMSF National Awards

The CMSF National Award is our most prestigious scholarship. It is awarded after a rigorous process, which includes the written application and extensive interviews by both the area committee and National Selection committee. In 2006, up to 30 National Award recipients will be chosen, each of whom will receive up to \$75,000 over four years of study, including summer enrichment funding, mentoring and counselling.

Amount

Up to \$8,000 per year plus a tuition stipend for up to four years of full-time undergraduate study at any one of our participating Canadian universities.

Value Added

Up to \$7,500 over the course of an undergraduate degree for participation in CMSF Summer Enrichment, a student-initiated travel and/or public policy opportunity.

CMSF Finalist Awards

The CMSF Finalist Award is a one-time entrance award valued at \$2,500 offered to all Finalists who attend National Selections but are not selected as National Award recipients. In 2006, approximately 40 Finalist Awards will be awarded to outstanding students from across Canada. The Award is tenable at any public Canadian university at which the recipient gains admission and enrolls in a full-time program of study of at least two years duration.

CMSF Provincial Awards

The CMSF Provincial Award is a one-time entrance award valued at \$1,500 and is tenable at any accredited university in Canada at which the recipient gains admission and enrolls in a full-time program of study.

The Morehead Award

The Morehead Award is offered in the U.S., the U.K. and Canada to students who show promise of exceptional value to the community. It is tenable only at the University of North Carolina (Chapel Hill, N.C.).

The Morehead Award is granted to as many as three students annually from Canada. It is valued at \$11,600 US annually. In addition, the Award also includes full tuition and out-of-state-fees for up to four years of undergraduate study plus a laptop computer. It includes four summer internships (approximate value \$4,200 annually) in the areas of outdoor leadership, service, travel/study and career-track interest.

Added Costs

Students will be responsible for all transportation costs and incidentals over \$50 US/month, totalling approximately \$2000 US per year. Tax liability: Canadian federal and provincial plus US federal and state, net liability \$1,200 - \$1,500 US per year.

Eligibility Criteria

Applicants must check off the Morehead box on the CMSF application to be eligible for this award. Canadian Morehead Finalists are selected and notified by December 27th, 2005 and must complete an application to UNC-CH before January 15th, 2006. All Morehead applicants should apply for the earliest possible sitting of the SAT: SAT-1 is required by UNC-CH; SAT-2 is strongly recommended. Final Morehead interviews will be held in Toronto, February 17-18, 2005.

GLOBAL TELEVISION BROADCASTERS OF THE FUTURE AWARDS

The Global Television "Broadcasters of the Future" awards are a series of scholarship, internship and mentorship programs designed to encourage and aid talented and enthusiastic Canadians toward establishing or furthering a career in the Canadian broadcast industry. These annual awards reflect Global Television's commitment to the personal growth of Canada's future broadcasters.

2006-2007 Global Television Aboriginal Peoples' Internship Award

This annual Internship Award offers an Aboriginal Canadian a challenging opportunity to work in private television in pursuit of a career in broadcasting. The Award places the award recipient in a four-month paid internship at one of our Global Television stations for the Summer of 2007.
